### The 1<sup>st</sup> Workshop on Information in Networks

The increasing availability of massive networked data is revolutionizing scientific study in fields as diverse as Computer Science, Economics, Physics and Sociology. Each of these fields studies questions which at their core involve ‘information in networks’—its distribution, its diffusion, its value, and its influence on social and economic outcomes. While many important advances have taken place in these different communities, the dialog between researchers across disciplines is only beginning. The purpose of this workshop is to bring together leading researchers studying information in networks from different perspectives in order to lay the foundation for ongoing relationships and to build a multidisciplinary research community. Speakers will share their recent research, which may have been published elsewhere, but which may not be widely known outside of their own disciplines. The workshop will combine a collection of invited talks, as well as poster presentations selected from a pool of submitted abstracts. As the workshop is intended to facilitate interaction, the program will include substantial time for discussion. We hope the energy of New York City will inspire the gathering, and that our participants will leave with new ideas and a stronger sense of community.

Abstracts will be evaluated as they are submitted and evaluation will continue until the program is filled. Space is limited, so interested researchers should submit as soon as possible.

Authors of accepted abstracts will be notified by September 1, 2009 and will be expected to submit a final version in Microsoft Word format not to exceed 5 pages, including references and figures, by September 15, 2009. Accepted abstracts will be printed in an informal working notes. Members of the press may attend the event and submission therefore indicates no objection to their presence during presentations.
